Crossing the Atlantic: Stories and Craft – KS2**

Dear Teachers,

I hope this email finds you well. The International Slavery Museum is closing so we are heading On Tour! I'm excited to announce an engaging opportunity for your Key Stage 2 groups to participate in our new outreach sessions at the International Slavery Museum.

Our On Tour "Crossing the Atlantic: Stories and Craft" is designed to deepen students' understanding of their local area and its connections to transatlantic slavery and its legacies through a dynamic combination of storytelling and craft. These sessions can either take place in your school or in a community setting, like the Caribbean Centre or LJMU Campus on select dates, providing a rich learning environment for young minds to explore and engage with history.

These sessions are comprised of two workshops, an Anansi story which introduces students to themes and concepts of Transatlantic slavery, and a Legacies craft session for students to learn about Liverpool's links to slavery and its legacies.

Moreover, the artwork created by the young participants during the craft session will be featured in next year's Slavery Remembrance Day Programme and displayed in the museum. This offers students a chance to contribute to a meaningful commemoration and share their perspectives with a wider audience.

These On Tour Sessions will provide a valuable educational experience for your students, enriching their understanding of local history and encouraging critical thinking about contemporary issues. Spaces are limited, so we encourage you to book early to secure your preferred dates.

Sessions are £375 and run for 2 hours for up to 60 students. The costs cover our operational resources and travel.

As a special offer for schools booking these sessions, we're thrilled to offer a generous 50% discount on a tour of the International Slavery Museum. This provides an excellent opportunity for students to visit the museum before it closes and further delve into the museum's exhibits and gain a deeper understanding of the historical context.
